We have all heard the stories and perhaps watched the shows about animal hoarding. Humans typically begin rescue work with good intentions, but soon find that one person cannot sustain large groups of animals alone without some form of repercussion. Sadly, this outcome can also be found in the breeding world. Irresponsible behavior known as "Backyard Breeding" is a sad reality that leaves animals severely neglected with little, if any, concern for their medical needs.

This spring, CCA received an unusual plea for help from a family desperate to break this terrible cycle of abuse for monetary gains. The mother had recently passed away, leaving 31 exhausted adult dogs in their care with no resources with which to sustain them. Finding everything from sour, matted fur to missing teeth and infected, bulging eyes, it was clear these animals needed serious medical care and fast.

Rescue operations were quickly arranged with a non-negotiable agreement that all breeding cease immediately. While assistance was expected from another local group, this proved unsuccessful. On March 19[,] 2023, CCA began the liberation effort for all 31 dogs.

The oldest in most dire need of medical care were transported first but their ride to freedom was anything but smooth. Only a few miles from the shelter, their vehicle was struck by a careless driver, slinging, and slamming them against their crates before coming to a stop amidst ongoing traffic. Thankfully, none were physically injured, but the psychological effects were evident. The little group of survivors proved their strength and resiliency through this and multiple major surgeries stemming from neglect over the next few weeks, becoming such an inspiration that they were officially named "The Fantastic Five."

Since the wreck, the living conditions and health of the remaining 26 dogs have improved dramatically, with nearly all now at the shelter and some already in homes of their own! Despite their heartbreaking past, glimmers of hope are seen every day through newly bright eyes, curiosity, and tail wags. We hope you will continue to follow us as we pour our hearts completely into the mission of healing this little group... one life at a time.

Who We Are

Founded in 1980, Concerned Citizens for Animals is celebrating 43 years of improving the lives of homeless animals in the Upstate. Through our shelter operation, and a variety of community service programs, CCA offers a second chance to neglected, stray and abandoned animals.

As the oldest no-kill shelter in the Upstate, CCA provides treatment, sterilization, care, and a safe haven for its residents until loving homes are found. Prospective homes are screened, references are checked and home visits made to ensure the animals are placed with responsible, caring individuals and families.

CCA's Feral Cat Program employs the TNR (trap, neuter, and return) process to assist feral cat colony caretakers in maintaining the health of the colony and curbing the colony's growth. Our Low Cost Spay/Neuter Program is effective in alleviating animal suffering by reducing the number of unwanted canine and feline births in the Upstate.

The combined efforts of an involved management team, dedicated caretakers, and an active volunteer force create a powerful influence in the lives of the animals in our care and those in the community we serve.

Mission Statement

CCA shall not euthanize any animal unless it is beyond medical care, and suffering would be the permanent result of medical treatment.

CCA shall operate an animal shelter for abandoned, sick, injured, or otherwise homeless animals.

CCA shall maintain an adoption program to permanently place homeless animals in qualified homes.

CCA shall maintain a low-cost spay/neuter program for the community.

CCA shall strive to prevent or stop any abuse, neglect, or otherwise inhumane treatment of any animal.
