## Rufio: A Celebration of Another Life Saved Lauren Frantz

Concerned Citizens for Animals (CCA) is a non-profit organization that has been working to find loving homes for abandoned and abused pets in the upstate for over thirty years. As the animal caretaker for CCA for the past two years, I have had the privilege of getting to see many former strays get their happy endings. From the kitten who lost his tail after a run-in with a car and got a new home for Christmas to the gentle giant of a dog dumped on someone's farmland who went on to become a PTSD service dog, there are countless stories I could tell of how our work at CCA has changed the lives of both the animals we care for and the people who love them. However, the story that is closest to my heart is that of my own dog, Rufio.

Rufio and his three siblings came to CCA when they were about eight weeks old. They had been living underneath an old truck and were incredibly sick when they first arrived. They were practically starving, their hip bones sharply jutting out from their sides, yet their little bellies were swollen with worms. Three of the four pups had severe hernias; one had a bad infection, and Rufio was nearly blind in his right eye from an old injury. They had had very little interaction with humans before coming to us and were terrified of even the gentlest touch, growling and hiding underneath anything small enough for them to squeeze under. The first time I picked up Rufio, he bit me on the arm, made a horrible screaming noise, and had an accident on the floor. Even as the other pups in the group made progress and gradually began to greet me with wagging tails and excited yips, Rufio always hung back in the corner, snarling and obviously uncomfortable with being touched. While the other pups played tug-of-war with each other, I would sit in the crate with Rufio, tossing treats to him and speaking softly until he got used to my presence enough to tolerate my hand caressing his head. Eventually, he came to look forward to our time together, and when the day came to introduce the puppies to a family that wanted to adopt, I had grown so attached to him that I wasn't sure that I wanted him to leave. Luckily, he decided for me, avoiding the prospective adopter and instead running up to me to ask for reassuring pats and belly rubs. In that moment, I knew that he was going to become a permanent part of my life.

A year and a half later, Rufio has blossomed into the sweetest, smartest, most affectionate dog I've ever met. Though he is still wary of strangers, to those that he loves, he offers his full and unconditional devotion. He is now trained to walk off-leash and enjoys long walks and games of fetch in the field up in front of the house. He has play-dates with other dogs from the shelter (which he loves) and shares a home with my two cats (who he tolerates). He has a large yard to play in during the day and snuggles with me in the bed every night...and sometimes refuses to stop snuggling in the morning to keep me from leaving! He can be a bit of a handful at times (the puppy in him still loves to chew on everything in sight.), but I wouldn't trade his silly antics and slobbery kisses for anything in the world. I was not planning to add a dog to my family when Rufio came into my life, and I certainly never would have expected the feisty little pup who once growled every time I tried to touch him to look at me with such affection in his eyes, but it is one of the best decisions that I have ever made. He has taught me as much or more about love than I have taught him, and I am incredibly proud to be his "doggy mom".

#### Who We Are

Founded in 1980, Concerned Citizens for Animals is celebrating 38 years of improving the lives of homeless animals in the Upstate. Through our shelter operation, and a variety of community service programs, CCA offers a second chance to neglected, stray and abandoned animals.

As the oldest no-kill shelter in the Upstate, CCA provides treatment, sterilization, care, and a safe haven for its residents until loving homes are found. Prospective homes are screened, references are checked and home visits made to ensure the animals are placed with responsible, caring individuals and families.

CCA's Feral Cat Program employs the TNR (trap, neuter, and return) process to assist feral cat colony caretakers in maintaining the health of the colony and curbing the colony's growth. Our Low Cost Spay/Neuter Program is effective in alleviating animal suffering by reducing the number of unwanted canine and feline births in the Upstate.

The combined efforts of an involved management team, a dedicated caretaker and an active volunteer force create a powerful influence in the lives of the animals in our care and those in the community we serve.

Mission Statement

CCA shall not destroy any animal unless it is beyond medical care, and suffering would be the permanent result of medical treatment.

CCA shall operate an animal shelter for abandoned, sick, injured, or otherwise homeless animals.

CCA shall maintain an adoption program to permanently place homeless animals in qualified homes.

CCA shall maintain a low-cost spay/neuter program for the community.

CCA shall strive to prevent or stop any abuse, neglect, or otherwise inhumane treatment of any animal.
